This course will help you to understand the purpose and context of a range of different methods, equipping you with the skills to undertake a qualitative or quantitative synthesis in a systematic review.

As well as learning about the wider context of research synthesis, you will undertake a thematic synthesis, meta-analysis and mixed-methods synthesis, covering the main requirements for most systematic reviews. There is also an optional topic on Realist Synthesis.
